

# A side event of the CaribVET Steering Committee

Joint sessions are organized with the CaribVET Steering Committee on Monday (Opening Ceremony) and Wednesday (HPAI Session) to discuss the main results obtained nationally and regionally for what relates to HPAI risk mapping in the Caribbean.

Theses outputs will allow to optimize monitoring systems, targeting more efficiently on the risk areas for vigilance and surveillance activities.
